

Painting with Light

This is exactly what the title suggests; you use a controlled light source to “paint” light onto a subject. This is usually done in the dark or under darker conditions. Light painting can be done in a studio setting (or your living room!) or out of doors. You’ll require:

- A) A camera capable of long exposures.
- B) A tripod or other method of keeping the camera in place.
- C) A light source. It could be something as simple as a standard flashlight (which likely won’t work to light up a tree from a distance) to a multi-million candle-power searchlight (easily located at almost any hardware store).
- D) A dark location.
- E) Optional: gel filters to colour the light.

You may need to scout the location (if outdoors) in advance or setting up and composing in the dark – even with a flashlight – may be a challenge.

Set your shutter speed for a long exposure; you may need to experiment a bit in order to find what works. It would probably be a good idea to stop-down your aperture, also.

Tripp the shutter (if you’re inside, the lights need to be out!) and begin to “paint”! Experiment with light intensity/distance to subject, how long you play the light over any one spot, what happens when you use different sources. Light painting needn’t include putting light on a subject – it can also mean using the light source as the subject itself! You could stand before a camera with a candle and create some neat images.

Lens Coatings

Just as light passing through a prism will be split into its component colours, each glass element within a lens does the same thing, only to a lesser degree. Lenses are composed of pieces (elements) of glass, often arranged in “groups”. Light will be affected by each piece of glass as it passes through the lens. Coatings help to reduce inner reflections (the forward-facing surface of each element being a mirror of sorts), and coatings help to correct the separation of the colours as the light passes through. Coatings also reduce flare which increases contrast. What may seem as counter-intuitive, lenses with multiple coatings actually allow more light to pass through than they would without!




